



TOP TIPS

- 1 Choose one of the colours as your main colour and use the second colour as an accent.
- 2 For the "ice" use crystal chandeliers and, glass or mirrored accessories; "fire" can be expressed by the colour of the flowers and candles.
- 3 Serve a signature drink as welcome drink. Try a Blue Ice Martini or a Red Kiss Martini.
- 4 Another way to use colour is to incorporate ambient lighting in one or both of your theme colours.
- 5 If your budget allows, end the evening with a fire display or fire poi (twirling).
